### RECEPTION

Reception have had another fantastic term. This term we have been learning about Space and Plants. We transformed our cabin into a space station where the children have been able to access lots of role play opportunities such as dressing up as astronauts, playing with space toys in our space tent, reading space themed books, making rockets with recyclable materials and lots of arts and crafts. We have been focusing on the book 'Whatever Next' in English and the children have had lots of writing opportunities based on this book.

We have also changed our indoor role play area into a garden centre and the children have loved buying and selling flowers to their friends and learning about the different parts of flowers and what they are called.

In Maths we have been focusing on numbers 8,9 and 10 and the children have been completing lots of work on subitizing and investigating the different compositions of these numbers using lots of different manipulatives.

## YEAR 1

This half term Year 1 have been learning all about the Amazon Rainforest. We have been learning about the climate, the animals that live in the rainforest, the layers of the rainforest as well as comparing and writing about the differences between the rainforest and Widnes. Our 'Rainforest' topic is linked to our key text 'The Great Kapok Tree'. Year 1 have been writing about the importance of looking after our beautiful planet and created a poster about protecting the rainforest, as well as researching and finding facts about the Amazon Rainforest to write a non-chronological report.

In Art, we have been studying the artist Andy Warhol and, in their sketchbooks, writing what they like about his pop art and how it makes them feel. The children produced some beautiful, detailed pieces of artwork of different animals that live in the rainforest, we then decided to display the sketchbooks in class as an art gallery.

Year 1 have thoroughly enjoyed their forest school sessions this half term and were able to work as a team and have shown great communication skills when creating birds' nests, storytelling, as well as creating artwork using natural materials.

Well done Year 1 for continuing to work hard and for all your fantastic work this half term.



## YEAR 2

What a fantastic half term we have been having in Year Two. We have learnt a bundle of new things, consolidated many more things and laughed along the way. Year Two particularly enjoyed learning about Nelson Mandela and all the amazing things he has done for the world we now live in. We have written a biography of his life and was interested in all aspects of it. We have continued to learn more about Africa, especially in Art where we have been looking at African patterns – Kente patterns.

During World Book Day, we really enjoyed weaving our own colourful fish that could be the friends of Tiddle, the awesome story book written by Julia Donaldson.

In our computing lessons we have been creating our own music with Music Lab – making music with drawings. This has been so much fun!

Finally, we have loved our Tennis sessions and are almost ready to take on Andy Murray or the Williams sisters. As always, we are looking forward to learning, exploring, and having more fun next half term.



## YEAR 3

### **The Victorians**

Year 3 have continued with their topic 'The Victorians' this half term, looking at Victorian invention which included essential inventions that we still use today such as the telephone, the bicycle, the lightbulb, the motorcar, the camera, and the flushing toilet! We learned that the most famous and useful inventions from history are ones that solved a common problem or made life better for people.

We have also enjoyed our reading text 'You Wouldn't Want to Be a Victorian Schoolchild' and learned that growing up in Britain in the 1880s wasn't easy. For a young child in school the going was tough, and the punishments were hard, with inventions such as wooden back straighteners designed to make sure there was no poor posture and slouching in class during the school day!

Widnes Vikings also returned to teach us more important P.E. skills this half term and we had the opportunity to participate in a community litter pick, supporting our local community and showing great citizenship.

Other highlights have included World Book Day (which we all embraced with such enthusiasm and enjoyed immensely); litter picking with the great Environmental Services team at Halton Borough Council; learning about Easter and Holy Week, and taking part in all of our Easter activities.



## YEAR 4

During this half-term, Year 4 have been working extremely hard learning all about rivers in Geography and Living things and their Habitats in Science.

We have been lucky enough, for a second time, to have some of our PE lessons taught by Widnes Vikings.

We had so much fun litter picking in our local area taking part in good citizenship activities and helping our environment.

However, our favourite subject this half-term has to be English. We loved reading and doing some fabulous World Book Day activities with our families, and we have thoroughly enjoyed reading our book, The Iron Man, fully embracing our written tasks. We particularly enjoyed creating our restaurant menus for the Iron Man and composing and performing our Iron Man raps!

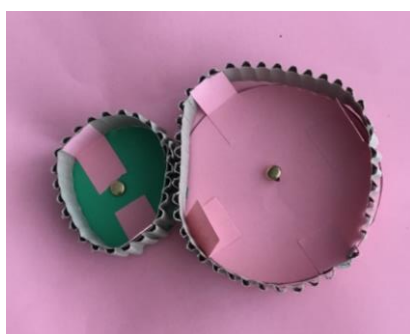


## YEAR 5

This half term, Year 5 were invited to take part in a Shakespeare primary schools festival. We had to contribute a scene from one of Shakespeare's plays. We decided to focus on 'Twelfth Night', since we have two sets of twins in our class and this play is all about twins who were separated during a shipwreck but are re-united at the end. During Shakespeare Week, we got to perform our play both in school for our parents, and at The Studio in Widnes. We were then treated to a performance of 'Murder, Mayhem and Magic', by professional actors. It was great fun and a fabulous experience. As well as exploring Shakespeare's legacy of language in our English lessons, we also learnt all about Shakespeare's life and made little books.

In our Science lessons this term, we have been investigating simple machines: gears, levers and pulleys. We have learnt that a gear is a wheel that has teeth. The teeth are used to turn other gears. A big gear will make a smaller gear turn faster, so a small force can have a bigger effect.

Year 6 have had some visitors in this term talking about healthy lifestyles by explaining the dangers of alcohol and tobacco. They found out some of the history and the science of how both substances can damage, not only the body, but cause social issues too.

The team from Halton were very knowledgeable and Year 6 asked some brilliant questions.



As well as our PSHE work we have been completing our topic on the ancient Maya people of South and Central America. We looked at how they were different from Anglo-Saxons and learnt some of their traditions and rituals. We even played our version of the ball game Pok-a-Tok. Luckily no-one was beheaded! Year 6 were fantastic and enthusiastic when researching and found out many strange and interesting facts like how the Maya did not wear clothes until they were 5! All of this and we still had time to prepare for SATs! A huge well done for all the hard work Year 6 have put in with all of their work, and let's enjoy your holidays before one last push until we get to our SATs.
