Year 2 Autumn Term 1 – Never Eat Shredded Wheat



Main Texts

The Lonely Beast by Chris Judge



Maths

We will start the year by learning to read, write and order numbers to 100 and develop their understanding of place value using the terms tens and ones. We will compare numbers starting to use the symbols < > =. In our calculations topic we are going to start to count in steps of 2, 5 and 10 as well as adding and subtracting using written methods. They will need to learn their number bonds to 10 and 20 for guick mental recall.



RE **Branch One: Creation and covenant**

In this branch we will learn about the story of Noah, focusing on God's promise (covenant) with Noah and all the creatures. We will also listen to Psalm 139 which is about God's creation of each of us and his love for us. At the end of the topic the children will celebrate ways in which we can show care for God's world Throughout this branch we will learn about the Sacrament of Baptism and the children will recognise the sacrament is when a person becomes part of the Christian family and promises to love God.

English

In English this term our focus texts will be based on the 'Lonely Beast' series of books by Chris Judge.

The children will learn about how to sequence stories and make storyboards, write character profiles and write letters to the characters in the stories. They will have the opportunity for role play and drama linked to the stories. Their focus for grammar will be different sentence types, statements, commands, questions and exclamation. They will look at word classes such as nouns, adjectives and verbs. When writing children will be encouraged to use a fullstop, capital letter and question mark accurately. Spelling this term will focus on learning to spell all common exception words for Year 1 and 2. Our Handwriting will focus on the correct size and shape of letters and spacing of words correctly.

Science

In our Science topic we will be looking at the different types of materials our school is made from. Throughout the topic we will learn the different properties and uses of different materials such as wood, metal, glass, plastic, paper, brick and clay. We will investigate which material is best for the Lonely Beast's tent and we will learn about everyday materials and will complete lots of experiments to investigate the suitability of different materials.
