RECEPTION

This term Reception has been focusing on Traditional Tales.

We have read the stories: The Three Little Pigs, The Gingerbread Man, The Three Billy Goats Gruff, Goldilocks and the Three Bears, Jack and the Beanstalk and Little Red Riding Hood.

Through these texts the children made 'Wanted' posters for the Big Bad Wolf, made traps to catch him and looked for clues, made sorry cards for the three little bears, made bridges outside for the Billy Goats Gruff. They also took part in a hot seating activity which promoted lots of questions and creative answers and they had a teddy bears picnic and made their own jam sandwiches.

In maths the children have been learning the number bonds to 5,6,7,8 and 9 and they have used different manipulatives to help with this. We have also been learning how to share things equally so there is the same amount and weighing items to see which is heavier and lighter.

We celebrated World Book Day, and we had a fantastic time dressed up as our favourite World Book Day characters. The children had lots of fun doing the treasure hunt outside and answering questions about different books. We finished the day by eating some cupcakes outside with our teddy bears and listened to some stories that the children had brought in.

We have also been learning how to play the Glockenspiel in Music. We have been playing familiar songs such as Twinkle Twinkle little star.

Reception also had a lovely time at the coffee morning with their families.


We can't wait for another fantastic term!































<u>Year 1</u>

This half term Year 1 have been learning all about the Amazon Rainforest. We have been learning about the climate, the animals that live there, the layers of the rainforest as well as comparing the differences between the Amazon and Widnes. Year 1 enjoyed reading our key text 'The Great Kapok Tree' and have been writing about the importance of looking after our beautiful world, and creating a poster about protecting the rainforest. We have also been researching and finding facts about the Amazon to write a non-chronological report.

In Art, children have been studying the artist Andy Warhol and discussed their thoughts about what they like about his pop art and how it makes them feel. Children produced some beautiful pop art of their own, drawing different animals that live in the Amazon rainforest.

Year 1 have thoroughly enjoyed their forest school sessions this half term and were able to work as a team and demonstrate great communication skills when creating birds' nests, storytelling, as well as creating artwork using natural materials.

Well done Year 1 for continuing to work hard and for all your fantastic work this half term.



<u>Year 2</u>

This half term Year 2 have been learning about 'Africa'. We have really enjoyed learning about the Serengeti National Park and the Maasai Mara Tribe! We have completed lots of research and written reports all about Africa in our English lessons. In our science lessons we have been learning about 'Living Things and their

Habitats'. We have spent lots of time in our school grounds exploring different habitats and micro-habitats. We found lots of different mini beasts and discovered that the worms are particularly fond of our new mud kitchen!

The children have shown a great interest in 'statistics' in maths and enjoyed collecting their own data and presenting it on a pictogram. In computing the children have been busy making their own music using an app called 'Chrome Music Lab'. In music the children have been learning the notes B, C, D and E on the glockenspiels. We had a fantastic time on World Book Day completing a range of fun activities. We even made our own 'character potatoes' based on our favourite story characters.















<u>Year 3</u>

In English, Year 3 have really liked our story 'Bill's New Frock' a story about a boy Bill who wakes up to suddenly find that he is a girl. He learns about the many differences in expectations for girls and boys. We have written fantastic diary entries putting ourselves in Bill's shoes for the day and portraying his moments of horror, outrage and despair. We have also written and performed a very funny play script acting out the scene when Bill is reluctantly crossed over the road by a kindly old lady!

In geography we have been taking 'Three Giant Steps' looking at Dover in the UK, France and Canada. We have learned lots about the 3 countries using maps and atlases. We have carried out research and have studied physical features like mountains, cliffs, rivers and waterfalls and looked at man-made landmarks such as the Port of Dover, the Eiffel Tower and Notre Dame in Paris and the CN Tower in Toronto.

We have also compared the 3 countries looking at size, climate, population, culture and language. In Art, we learned all about the French Impressionists and painted our own pictures in the style of Claude Monet.

In P.E. we have had some brilliant tennis and cricket lessons with expert coaching from Tia and Paul – a big thank you to you both from Year 3!



We have been so busy this half term, enjoying fantastic music lessons with Mrs Mc Elroy from Liverpool Archdiocese culminating in a dazzling concert for parents singing the songs from 'Joseph: The Musical'.

We have also been doing our bit for the environment by litter-picking in our local park which coincided with 'World Book Day'. The day was a huge hit as we all came to school dressed up as our favourite characters.





Year 4

During this half-term, Year 4 have been working extremely hard learning all about 'Rivers' in geography and 'States of Matter' in science. Using atlases and research on the internet, we were able to list rivers and mountains in the UK showing where they are on a map. We took part in many science investigations such as measuring the changes in the volume of water over time and finding out how surface area affects evaporation time. We also enjoyed looking at the water cycle, using scientific vocabulary to describe it.

Following on from our history topic, 'the Romans', last half-term, we had a fantastic time visiting the Grosvenor Museum in Chester. We had the opportunity to have a guided tour of Chester with a real Roman solider and took part in lots of interesting workshops.





During our PE lessons, we loved pushing ourselves during athletics, trying to beat our personal bests in sprinting and other track sports. However, our favourite subject this half-term must be English. We loved reading and doing some fabulous World Book Day activities in class. Showing good citizenship, we even went litter picking around the local area dressed up – we did get some funny looks! We also thoroughly enjoyed reading our book, The Iron Man, fully embracing our written tasks. We particularly enjoyed creating our restaurant menus for the Iron Man, producing our own newspaper reports, and composing and performing our Iron Man raps!



<u>Year 5</u>

This half term Year 5 attended a fabulous series of child safety workshops at the Ubique Barracks in Widnes called 'Crucial Crew'. The police, road safety officers, magistrates and health professionals provided the different stations. These were not only informative, but highly engaging too.

We learnt how to put an unconscious person into the recovery position, as well as keeping safe around electricity pylons and sub-stations.



Most importantly, we learnt a lot about on-line safety. We know how to make secure passwords, and how to work on the ARB principle (Adult, Report, Block) if we're contacted by anyone that we don't know in real life.



We had a really enjoyable time on World Book Day.

Our swimming lessons have now transferred to the brand new leisure centre. Our first lesson there was on the very first day it opened! We are improving our skills and growing in strength and confidence every week.

Throughout this half term in our Science lessons, we have been investigating simple machines such as gears, levers and pulleys. We designed and made our own gears and pulleys.



Finally, our half term has ended with us taking part in Shakespeare Week. We have learnt all about life in Tudor times, as well as exploring the plays of the Bard and making our own Shakespeare booklets



<u>Year 6</u>

This term, Year 6 have been very busy studying hard in maths and English for SATs. We have been staying after school for our maths and English clubs solving some very difficult brainteasers and puzzles and reading some interesting stories too, helping the children really get under the skin of everything they read. This is on top of all the hard work Year 6 put in in class, with us covering some difficult topics like ratio, algebra, subjunctive form and semi-colons. But, Year 6 have been up to the task and have shown a great deal of perseverance and determination this last term. Everyone at the school is both extremely proud of how well the children are preparing for SATs and the progress they've made.

Of course, there is more to school than just SATs! In PE we have been continuing to improve our rugby skills with Sean from the Widnes Vikings. Our very competitive class have been loving the kicking game, and I am pleased to say they have all improved greatly. Also, in PE we have been learning about cricket. Most of Year 6 have a new found fondness for one of our national sports! I am always pleasantly surprised at how well Year 6 take to learning new sports, and how much they improve in a short space of time - and cricket is a great example of this. We have some excellent bowlers, batters and fielders! Well done to Year 6 for continuing to show dedication in PE!

In Music we were lucky enough to take a trip to the Liverpool Philharmonic to watch the world-famous Philharmonic Orchestra perform. Some of the playing was outstanding and we learned how music affects us both physically and emotionally. A great example of this was when the orchestra played a piece called "Colourful Clouds Chasing the Moon". Nearly all of our class were hypnotised by the melody and sent into a deep trance - one almost fell asleep! That's the power of music!

Back in class we have been finishing our website about Central American countries and learning all about the ancient people who lived there - the Maya! This very interesting civilisation was famed for its amazing understanding of the universe, its colourful gods, and its sport: Pok-a-Tok which we have been learning. Luckily, we won't get sacrificed if we lose. In Art we have been doing an Easter competition to make an Easter scene inspired by a piece of scripture. Let's hope Year 6 win something!
