

Psalm Response

'What great deeds the LORD worked for us! Indeed, we were glad'.

Why do these things happen?

All kinds of terrible things occur in our world, for instance earthquakes. The recent earthquakes in Myanmar got me thinking 'Why do these things happen?'.

The earthquakes in Myanmar have had a devastating impact. Two large earthquakes have shaken the country, followed by further shocks. It is the most powerful earthquake to strike Myanmar since 1912. At least 2,800 people have died and over 4,600 are injured – many of them children. Sadly, numbers are expected to rise further.

We might ask ourselves why a perfectly good, almighty and all-knowing God permits these terrible things. This is a complex theological and philosophical question, one with no definitive answer. Some would argue that these things are a test of faith, some interpret natural disasters as a sign of divine judgment or warning, others believe that God is in control of all things, even natural disasters, and that He allows them for reasons that may not be fully understood by humans.

As a Catholic scientist, I take the view that natural disasters are simply the result of natural laws and processes, and that God is not directly responsible for them. I would argue that this way of thinking aligns with Catholic teaching, something called natural law. Natural law refers to a universal, objective moral order accessible through reason. What do you think?

Whatever the philosophical and theological complexities of these arguments, our response must be to 'love your neighbour as yourself' (Mark 1230-31). As Christians we must do all we can to respond to these disasters in a practical and meaningful way, including prayer.
